
Woodland Friends - Rosa & Bo



We LOVE this version because you can personalise it with your own pictures, so you can include family photos, and pictures of your home and local area, which is brilliant for promoting cognition and speech and language. This will be treasured and played with for many years to come.

<u>Magna Tiles -</u> <u>Smyths Toys</u>

This 48-piece magnetic block set will keep them busy for hours! We love this set, and your child will enjoy playing with it for years to come. These flat magnetic tiles will teach your child about science and maths through play as they learn about how to construct 3D shapes, tunnels and turrets while thinking about weight distribution, height, size and much more. A large number of pieces makes it a great gift for siblings of different ages, while joining the pieces supports the development of cognition and motor skills. What a winner!

<u>Den Kit -</u> <u>Ordnance Survey</u>

Perfect for your little adventurer, this kit contains everything you need for a day outside! It contains a tarpaulin, groundsheet, mallet, mug, tent pegs, rope and even face paint for camouflage. Your child will develop a love of the outdoors and make fond memories with this kit, which will also encourage them to think creatively and critically about creating their own den, in whatever space they find. We also love that it contains no single-use plastic, and the packaging is 100% recyclable, 2 making it good for the environment too.



Mini Micro Eco Scooter

The scooter is a wonderful motor toy for your child, and we love this version because not only has it got light-up wheels that use induction energy from the scooting motion, but it also has extra strong breaks, adjustable handlebars, a grippy footplate and is made from discarded fishing nets! It is a great way to get around your local area while also encouraging your child to strengthen large gross motor muscles and improve coordination and control.



<u>Play Kitchen -</u> <u>Soren's House</u>

A kitchen is a great larger play item (if you have the room) and this one is so reasonably priced, gender-neutral and contains lots of storage space. Children best role-play things that they see, so a kitchen is usually a great addition if they're interested in pretend play.
